Age Group Changes from 2026

From 2026, changes to the age groups will affect athletes currently in the under 13, under 15 and under 17 categories. The new recognised age groups will be:

- **Under 10s** – Years 3 and 4
- **Under 12s** – Years 5 and 6
- **Under 14s** – Years 7 and 8
- **Under 16s** – Years 9 and 10
- **Under 18s** – Years 11 and 12

The under 10s will be a newly recognised age group. While it will take time for athletes and parents to adjust, the changes will align us with World Athletics and ease pressure in the under 18 age group for those aiming to compete internationally.

Glasgow Open Event

A superb performance from **Jaiten Best** (under 17 women). She set a new county triple jump record and therefore a club record of 12.17m.

Leicester Podium Event

Following on from **Jaiten Best's** record, **Alex Riley** smashed the national under 20 5000m road race record with a time of 13.41s. **Alex Riley** is continuing to show exceptional talent after his World Under 20 appearance last year.

In America, **Lizzy Korczak** demolished the senior and under 23 county javelin records with a throw of 58.10m. This moved her to 7th on the UK all-time list and 3rd as an under 23.

World Indoor Championships, Nanjing, China

At the World Indoor Championships in Nanjing, China, **Amber Anning** overcame some rough tactics from an American rival to win her first world title in the 400m, possibly the first of many. **Amber Anning** is the first British athlete to win a World indoor sprint title.

Sussex Under 15 League

These matches are run at Withdean, and Brighton secured a narrow win over our main rivals, Crawley. There were many fine performances on the night, but pride of place goes to **Florence Matten** for a new club pole vault record of 3.20m.

Youth Development League – Upper Age Group

This was another home fixture, and we recorded a resounding win, finishing nearly 100 points ahead of our nearest rivals. There were many great performances from the team.

Sussex Under 13 League

At the first meeting of their season, **Monty Rowland** improved on his county record with a throw of 44.39m. This was the longest throw by an under 13 boy since 2019.

On the track, **Ada Greenaway** ran a new Under 13 girls club record for the 600m in a time of 1.41.4s.

Youth Development League – Lower Age Group

A superb turnout by our members and so many great performances.

At Loughborough, **Ava James** smashed the under 20 and senior 3000m steeplechase club record with a time of 10.58.91s.

A busy weekend followed in May, with the under 15s competing in the Sussex League at Withdean and the YDL Upper Age Group match taking place at Kingston. The home fixture attracted a good turnout, but numbers were very disappointing at Kingston. The under 15s secured another win, while a 5th-place finish at Kingston followed their victory at the first match, showing what a bit of travelling can do to team numbers.

The season continued at pace with the Sussex Steeplechase Championships at Withdean. **Ava James** starred by knocking another five seconds off her recent club record, which now stands at 10.53.04s.

Two days later, the second YDL Lower Age Group match took place, again at Withdean. Another convincing victory was recorded, with pride of place going to **Florence Matten**,

who set a new club record in the under 15 pole vault with a clearance of **3.30m**.

It was a superb performance from all our athletes, with the added bonus of largely staying dry despite the forecast.

Southern Age Group Championships, Crystal Palace

On the same weekend, the Southern Age Group Championships were held at Crystal Palace. On the first day, **Arthur Rogers** won the under 15 javelin with a new personal best of 46.44m. On day two, **Florence Matten** claimed another title in the under 15 girls pole vault, clearing 3.20m.

Other medallists included **Jaiten Best** with a silver medal in the under 17 women's triple jump with a leap of 11.85m, **Klara Novak-Wightman** in the under 15 girls long jump, winning bronze with a new personal best of 5.07m, and **Alexandra Koloutsos**, who also won bronze in a very tight under 15 girls high jump competition with a clearance of 1.60m, the same height as the winner. **Felix Fowler** bettered this in the under 15 boys high jump, taking second place with a clearance of 1.65m.

Sussex Schools Championship

As usual, this was a very busy day for all concerned. Three of our athletes achieved championship best performances: **Jaiten Best** in the intermediate girls triple jump with a leap of 11.49m, **Jessica Bliss** in the senior girls 100m hurdles with 14.45s, and **Arthur Rogers** in the junior boys javelin with a throw of 50.80m. This javelin mark broke a record that had stood since 1971 and was also a club record.

Another record to fall was the under 20 women's 1500m steeplechase, where **Ava James** continued her rich vein of form with a time of 5.06.90s. A further club record was posted by **Louis Ashworth** in the under 15 boys 300m, improving his own mark with a time of 37.47s.

Schools Inter-Counties, Crawley

Two of our athletes posted new club records at this event. **Arthur Rogers** added to his recent record with a throw of 51.30m, while **Louis Ashworth** ran 37.23s in the 300m.
